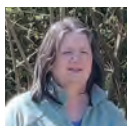

Councillors update:



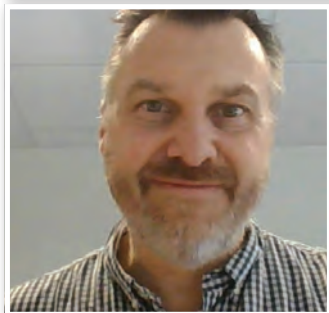
Julie Lacey

Any residents living close to the site of a proposed location for a new bench will be canvassed for feedback before any decisions are made.

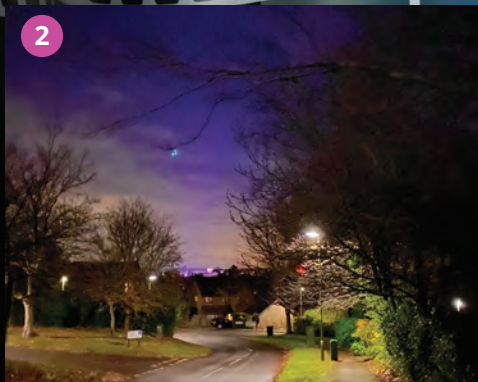
A special commemorative bench to mark the Platinum Jubilee is also in the pipeline.

Volunteers will help try and repair them and share their skills.

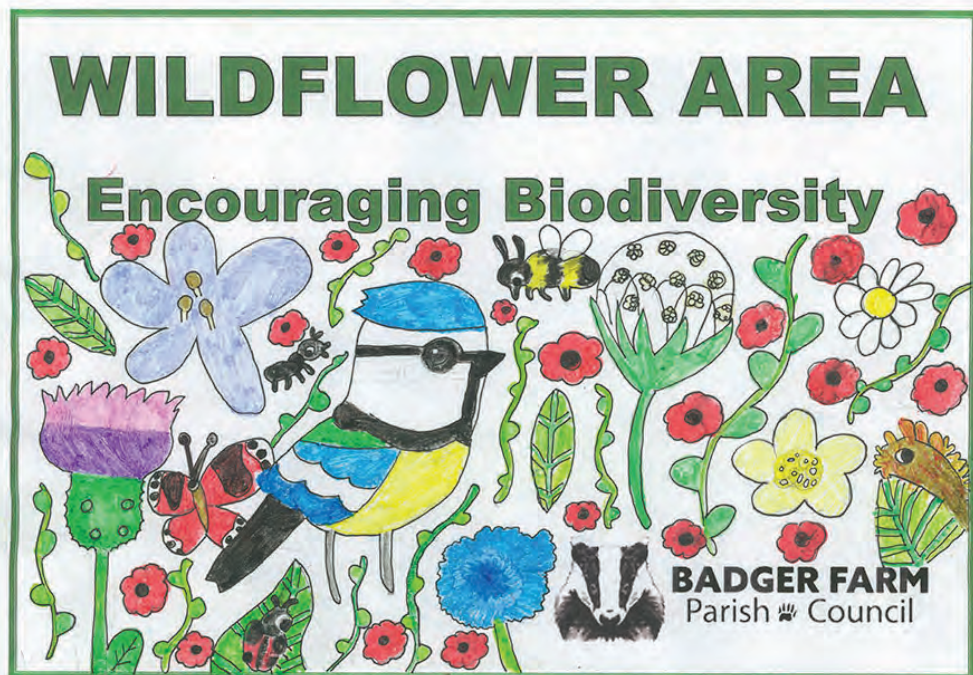
Winchester Repair Café will be launched during **WinACC's Green Week 24 Sept - 2 Oct 2022.**



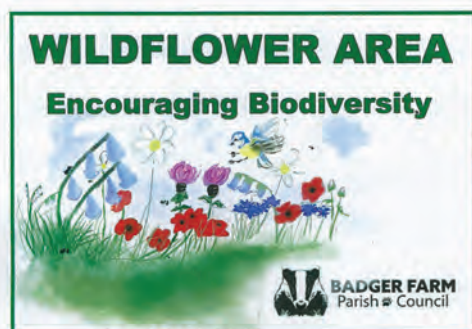

We have also been excited to see that our yellow rattle seeds (sown

last Autumn by our group of volunteers) have started to come up.

Yellow rattle is a wildflower that is parasitic on grass, so it should help keep the grass down and allow the other flowers to flourish.

SHELAA (Strategic Housing and Land Availability Assessment) update

As part of the process of creating an updated Local Plan, there was a 'call for sites' by Winchester City Council to help identify land that could be used for future development.

The resulting list has caused a great deal of controversy, although Winchester City Council are at pains to point out that "It should be noted that inclusion in the SHELAA via the 'Call for Sites' does not give any planning status and does not allocate sites or imply that the council will necessarily grant planning permission."

Chairman of Badger Farm Parish Council, Cllr John Godbold, recently attended a meeting of local parish council chairmen to discuss concerns arising from the SHELAA.

It was decided to ask Winchester City Council for an extension on the consultation period to enable parishes to fully consult with their residents.

Badger Farm Parish Council will not be undertaking a survey of parishioners as there are no SHELAA sites within our parish.

However, we do encourage residents to make their views known to WCC and their district councillors.

The main area of concern for Badger Farm is that several neighbouring parishes are of the opinion that Bushfield Camp should be added to the list for housing.

If this happened, the site known as CS12 would no doubt be included.

This would bring development right up to the top part of Whiteshute Ridge.

A large development in this area would stretch our infrastructure and access routes to breaking point.
