d) Play Equipment

The Clerk has a meeting with two representatives of play equipment manufacturers tomorrow, when plans have been received (we have a third quote from Vita Play already) the subcommittee will meet to look at the plans. Cllr Dolby asked that we consider also accessible play equipment, plus we are seeking quotes for adult gym style equipment that could be placed at various locations in Badger Farm.

Council **AGREED** that these defects should be monitored.

e) Transport

The report was received after the Clerk had left her office so it will be forwarded to all Councillors.

Pitt Farm enabling works are a problem, plus the school buses will cause further problems. Cllr Lamming confirmed that the road was not widened due to the inspector confirming that the road was already sufficient to take the proposed increase in traffic. Should the additional [plans for housing are granted there is a major problem for our residents on the horizon.

There are some 10pm – 6am road closures planned. We note that the school intends to use the park and ride and with the lack of a drop off area at the school due to increased classrooms and no new school proposed for the new site will cause further problems for parking in Badger Farm.

k) County Council Rep – Cllr Bailey

(i) No report but he had the Silverwood Close road surface checked – no problem. Plus the root damage by the Community centre is on Sainsbury's land. - Noted

l) City Council Reps

(i) Cllr Lamming commented on Harrow Down – the owners have two months to clean up the garden and make the house habitable a 215 Order has been served.
Silverwood Close – unauthorised buildings – the owner has been told to make a retrospective application or be served with enforcement action.
Broadchalke Down – again a 215 order is proposed to get this garden cleared up and the house made habitable.

Winchester Hospital – there is a public meeting at 18; 30 on 30th September could as many people as possible attend. There are moves to lose 150 beds and lose the trauma status. A new hospital is proposed near Micheldever that will become a dedicated trauma hospital.
It is important that we also have representation to the clinical commission meetings on this subject; Winchester Hospital is landlocked and cannot be extended any more plus the parking problem but if you live in Chandlers Ford or Eastleigh Micheldever is a long was to go.
